I. PREPARATION OF YOUR STAY

1 - VISA APPLICATION TO ENTER FRANCE FOR NON-EUROPEANS

Students should contact the French consulate or embassy in their country of residence to apply for a student visa as soon as possible. The process can be lengthy depending on the case.

Ensure that the passport is valid for at least 6 months.

2 - ACCOMMODATION

We offer you the possibility of new accommodation for your Parisian semester, from September 1 2021 to January 31 2022.

These accommodations are in the heart of the Condorcet Campus located in Paris Aubervilliers, 10 minutes walk from the Front Populaire metro line 12. The monthly cost is 330.40 €. The accommodation is equipped with a shower room and kitchenette. In addition to this monthly rent, there is a lump sum (for the whole semester) of about 202 €. Paris is a very expensive city and we would like to make it clear that if you do not accept this accommodation, we will not be able to offer you other accommodation.

The Campus Condorcet has a helpdesk for foreign students for all administrative procedures.

If you wish to come before September 1 2021, please let us know your arrival date.

3 - BUDGET

In Paris, plan on a monthly budget of €700 to €900 to cover your expenses.

For the first month, you will need to:

- Advance the security deposit (an amount equivalent to a rent. This deposit will be returned to you when you leave if the accommodation is returned in good condition);
- Obtain your residence permit ;
- Subscribe to a monthly Parisian transport pass: Navigo. The cost is €75.20. Information and fares: www.ratp.fr - under "getting around", "tickets & fares". Available on a monthly basis, the RATP Navigo card allows you to make as many journeys as you wish throughout the Ile de France (Paris and Paris suburbs).

Students are entitled, like all students, to housing assistance. For foreign students, the only additional document required is a residence permit valid for more than four months and for the current academic year.

This measure applies to all foreign nationals, including those from the EEC.

This aid is allocated and paid by the « Caisse d'allocations familiales » (CAF). The amount of the allowance varies according to your resources and the amount of your rent.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

1 - RESIDENCE PERMIT

Students apply for a residence permit when they arrive in France. Applications must be made online at the following address: <https://administration-etrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/particuliers/#/>

The student visa is a mandatory requirement for foreigners who want to study in France.

2 - MEDICAL PROTECTION



If you are a national of a European country (EU): before your arrival in France, ask your social protection centre for a European health insurance card. Its validity must cover the duration of your studies in France, Italy and Portugal. You will then be exempt from joining the student social security scheme in France.

If you are under 28 years of age and from a non-European country: you will be affiliated to the student social security scheme in France, the cost of which is approximately € 215 and is included in your Master's course fees.

If you are over 28 years old: you must take out private insurance in your home country, or in France.

Foreign students must apply to the Social Security for a "carte vitale" which gives access to reimbursements for part of their medical care. All information can be found on the website: <http://www.ameli.fr>

The University of Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne's Social Assistants' Office provides students with the addresses of medical centres in collaboration with the University. Each student must choose a doctor.

3 - A BANK ACCOUNT OPENING

The University of Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne offers selected students who do not already have a bank account in France to open an account at the BNP Paribas Bank near the Malher Center. To open an account, the following documents are required: passport, visa, accommodation certificate.

An appointment can then be made before the student arrives in Paris in order to save time on the opening of the account on which many administrative procedures depend.

As soon as the student arrives, he or she will open the account. The student will then receive a "visa electron" payment card with immediate debit, which is subject to a prior balance enquiry. The payment limit is €1,500 per 30-day period. The ATM withdrawal limit is €300 every 7 days. The cost of this withdrawal card is €4/month.

4 - REGISTRATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PARIS 1 PANTHEON-SORBONNE

Students are fully responsible for their registration. Once the Master's fees have been paid, at the end of September, the student cards can be issued. Students receive their cards at the end of October.

Registration is done online.

III. EDUCATIONAL PACKAGE

1 - INTEGRATION WEEK

An integration week of intensive French and English courses for Erasmus students is organised by the Language Department of the University Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne. Your level will be determined using an online test, and then groups of levels will be formed (**attendance on the first day is compulsory for the level tests**). Registration will take place during the first course.

2 - LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

The TPTI Master's programme is very rigorous in terms of its language policy. The language of instruction is French in the three partner universities of the Master.

The curriculum includes a specific language course for each semester worth 5 ECTS credits. In the first semester, weekly French classes for non-French speaking students are offered to students with difficulties.

The languages taught will therefore be:

S1: Paris - French or English and Italian or Portuguese

S2: Padua - Italian and English

S3: Evora - Portuguese and French or English.

It is recommended that students perfect their French before arriving in Paris.
